Two waves of refugees in Poland 1st in 2021 and 2nd in 2022

- 1st wave in 2021 - Migration crisis on the border between Belarus and the European Union in summer and autumn of 2021 caused by the organized by the President of Belarus, transfer of immigrants and refugees (mostly young men) to the European Union, incl. from Iraq, Afghanistan and other countries of the Middle East and Africa, across the Belarusian-Lithuanian border, as well as Belarusian-Polish and Belarusian-Latvian border.
 - 2nd wave in 2022 - Since February 24, 2022, the day of the beginning of Russia's aggression, 2.86 million refugees from Ukraine have crossed the Polish-Ukrainian border, mostly women and children.

 - There are special news channels, and websites in Ukrainian for refugees.
